Lighting of the Advent Wreathe – Candle of Peace

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned. (Is. 9.2) On this Second Sunday of Advent, as we think about the coming of Jesus Christ, we light the candle of peace.

What is Confirmation?

According to the "Handbook of Faith for Anglicans," the sacrament of Confirmation enables a baptized person to confirm the promises made on their behalf at baptism. The confirmation candidates stand before the Bishop of the Diocese and commit themselves to serve Christ, our Lord, and Master. They kneel before the Bishop to receive the Laying on of Hands, and the Holy Spirit strengthens them to enable them to keep their promises. (Acts 8:4-8, 14-17)
